Bilal Muslim Mission of Kenya in collaboration with Helping Hands youth group conducted an Anti-Jiggers campaign on Sunday 07th February 2021. This campaign was held in a village named Ramisi Bodo in the South Coast region of Kwale County.

Outreach:

93 students of Madrassatul Qadiriya between the age ranges of 3 – 16 years were treated. The treatment included washing their feet and surgically removing the jiggers. The helping hands youth group organized a meal for more than 100 children which was distributed after the treatment. This program was mainly aimed to distribute food and health support to communities affected due to Covid-19.



Other volunteers:

The Jaffery Medical team provided a medical officer who trained the volunteers of the Helping Hands Youth Group. Zainab Manzu a nurse from Jaffery Medical was also part of the campaign to treat those affected.
