

CHENGONI PRE-PRIMARY SCHOOL

PROGRESS REPORT

(December 2022)

Earlier, The Centre had 2 preprimary classes, however space was very limited as every class had 30 pupils. Some children would sit down on the floor during lessons.

The newly built Chengoni Pre-primary unit was operational from August 2022 after enrollment of all pupils was done. Chengoni Pre-primary School is a well-structured, equipped and a well secured learning environment. Our teachers are innovative, creative and competent in their work and are ready to transform young minds to achieve their full potential.

Our school is prepared to nurture children physically, socially and emotionally. Through our fully equipped playground, learners are assisted by the teachers to have healthy physical exercise during their playtime. Pupils are also provided with a daily cup of fortified porridge at 10.00 a.m. A well fed child is able to concentrate during class and remain active rest of the day. Most of the pupils hail from difficult living conditions. At the new facility we aim to train them on basic hygiene, inculcate good habits they can replicate at home. Inculcate a reading habit including reading to their parents and providing them a head start on their education journey.

The physical environment is well managed by the school gardener. Trees have been planted around the institution to maintain a green safe environment for the young learners. This way, the pupils are in a position to learn on ways to manage their compounds in their homesteads. The compound is kept clean throughout the day.





The school closed on 25th November 2022 and new term will start on 23rd January 2023. The year 2023 will have 3 terms and so far 43 pupils have enrolled for 2023.





The new Competency Based Curriculum (CBC) covers a range of learning areas such as language, logic (mathematics), creativity and religious knowledge. It focuses on learning through doing and includes a lot of practical project work. The teachers, having sufficient experience in these areas, are able to guide learners through practical sessions of learning, healthy habits,

hygiene and religious guidance.





ACHIEVEMENTS:

- 1. Use of technology through Tablets during lessons has made day to day learning easier and interesting for young learners. Students are able to learn number and letter recognitions better through visual and audio interpretation.
- 2. Pupils actively participate in extracurricular activities
- 3. The Feed a Child Program has boosted their energy levels to sustain through the whole day.
- 4. There is visible Improvement in the academic performance of students due to the quality of education offered by teachers.

5. English language skill enhanced. Children now are able to confidently speak basic English

FUTURE PLANS

- 1. Proposal by the community and parents to expand the school and introduce Primary Level from Grade 1 to 6. Parents are worried what next for their children after completing quality pre-primary education at our school as there will be no sustainability of quality studies if they are to join public primary schools.
- 2. Educational books and toys required to develop motor and thinking skills of the children.
- 3. Appropriate films and videos will also be shown to children and their parents so that parents take a more active role in their children's education.
- 4. Introduce children's exposure to different languages like Arabic and French, in addition to the current lessons in English and Kiswahili.
- 5. A vocational school with tailoring and computer classes as well as a community library are also planned for the future.
