ROGRAM

There has been a d **KEPUKI** ood security in various regions of Kenya since July 2022. One of the main factors contributing to the food insecurity is the poor rainy season which resulted in below average crop production to near crop failure and poor livestock production. The nutrition situation has majorly deteriorated across counties resulting to acute malnutrition among younger children.

Most of the Students enrolled in the PrePrimary and Madrassah classes in our 15 centres hail from poverty stricken households. To ensure children are well fed and nourished Bilal Muslim Mission of Kenya with the constant support provided by WFAID/AFED conducts a Feed A Child program in all the 15 centres

Bilal Kenya was able to provide *744 cups* of porridge to preprimary students from Monday to Friday and *2,467 cups* of porridge to Madrassa students on Saturday and Sunday during September-November 2022.

Benefits of the Feed A Child Program:

- 1. Has promoted a higher school attendance and reduced the rate of absenteeism/drop outs.
- 2. Has resulted to an improved overall health of children
- 3. Has improved the level of concentration and academic performance of children
- 4. Higher energy levels has enabled students to be active during lesson and extracurricular activities.
