ROGRAM

According to an article on *Kelley web* or May 2022 most areas in Kenya have been experiencing Food insecurity. Three consecutive failed rainy seasons resulting in lost crops and an extremely high rate of livestock deaths have had a devastating effect on the livelihoods of communities. As a result of the above, Malnutrition rates remain high and could worsen if no immediate humanitarian assistance is provided. About 755,000 children under the age of five in Kenya will likely suffer from acute malnutrition throughout 2022 and need treatment.

In an attempt to combat with this issue Bilal Muslim Mission of Kenya with the Continuous support from WF-AID/AFED was able to provide a daily cup of porridge to Madrassah and Preprimary Children from all the 15 BMMKenya Centres.

Bilal Kenya was able to provide 739 cups of porridge to preprimary students from Monday to Friday and 2,482 cups of porridge to Madrassa students on Saturday and Sunday during May-July 2022.

The Feed a child Program has:

- 1. Increased energy levels of students.
- 2. Improved their ability to cope with a long day at school.
- 3. Improved their Immune System.
- 4. Had a positive impact on the academic performance of students.
