Introduction

Bilal Muslim Mission of Kenya arranged a joint workshop for all its Pre- Primary and I.R.E teachers at Imam Ar-Ridha Islamic Centre, Mtongwe on 21st to 28th March, 2021. A total of 39 Teachers (14 male and 25 female) attended.

OBJECTIVES

- 1. Enhancing teachers' professionalism through building on and polishing up their knowledge and skills.
- 2. Acquisition of skills on the use of new technology in advancing their teaching methodologies and techniques.
- 3. Enhancing good interpersonal skills on communication and awareness of their social responsibilities and cooperation through teamwork.

- Evening forums were also held where participants discussed challenges faced in their fields of work and shared ideas on networking and cooperation.
- ➤ A follow up program will commence once schools open for the new term.
- A crèche was organized for all nursing mothers and this facilitated a good and conducive learning environment for them.

Conclusion:


