LIVEGOAT PROGRAM INDEPENDENT CENTRES










This year as in previous years, Our Economic Upliftment Program has been proactively working on the Livegoat Initiative. Our last report covered efforts undertaken in the months of January and February 2024. Building on previous achievements, efforts were expanded to support 13 Independent Centres in the month of May 2024. 141 goats were distributed to 47 beneficiaries, with each recipient receiving 2 female goats and one male goat. Recipients included widows, orphans and disabled individuals.



Healthy goats

To ensure healthy goats were provided to the beneficiaries and to enhance the probability of a successful run of the program, all goats were dewormed and vaccinated against lung infections and severe dermatitis.













Training

Beneficiaries received some training to ensure their efforts are successful. This included:

- Providing suitable housing/shelter
- Goat health this included information on *how to deworm the goats* and advice on when individuals can treat their goats themselves versus when they need professional intervention
- Sustainable breeding
