

MOYENI TAILORING CLASS (OPENING) REPORT

The Mission offers tailoring Course as per the government Syllabus in order to empower Women and young girls in the villages. Currently there are four tailoring classes run by Mission in Mwasafu, Mackinnon Road, Bahakanda and Samburu Center. The classes are run in two sessions i.e. morning and afternoon, as women in the villages have to work on farms and attend to other household chores.

While in training, students are taught to stitch and mend simple dresses and how to generate an income and manage a dressmaking business. Most of the students who benefit are young girls who have dropped out of school.





The Mission had been receiving several requests from the Residents of Moyeni Centre to start up a tailoring class, however due to lack of space this request was put on hold as an entire new classroom was required for this project. Not too long after, this request was put to reality with the generous support provided by Help Dunya. Bilal Muslim of Kenya was able to start up its fifth

tailoring class in Moyeni Centre on 10th February 2022. Centre Staff, centre Committee and the community at large are glad on the opening of this facility as it will be of great benefit to the young girls and women in the Centre. The total number of students that have joined are 11 and more expected to enroll.



The Mission intends to expand the tailoring project by initiating a class in the remaining centres to ensure all girls and mothers can acquire this skill and become independent by earning an income from it.
